Fall Leaf Collection

As Fall approaches, so does the City's annual leaf collection program. The Service Department strives to provide leaf collection service equally on each street. Please take note that the leaf collection truck cannot make return trips until they complete the entire cycle of streets. Please make sure your leaves are put out on the tree lawn before the truck comes down your side of the street. The truck will not turn around and you will have to wait until the cycle completes before the truck will return. Please refrain from adding branches, twigs, rocks, and other debris in your pile of leaves. Do not place leaves in the roadway. The truck cannot pick up damp or snow covered leaves.

Snow Removal

It is your duty to keep sidewalks clean from obstruction. Snow must remain on the property from which it is shoveled or plowed. Snow piles must not exceed a height that will impair the vision of pedestrians or motorists. Snow should not be piled within a five-foot diameter from any fire hydrant.

Curbside Recycling Program

Recycling will be picked up every other week on the same day specified in this schedule. Please use the 65-gallon recycling cart provided by Kimble. Please do not use your recycling cart for extra garbage. Recycling carts containing rubbish will not be emptied.

All refuse will be picked up once a week on the day specified in the schedule on page 18. Trash should be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00 P.M. the evening before the designated trash collection day, and no later than 7:00 A.M. the day of trash collection. Refuse must be placed in the the Kimble provided 95-gallon refuse cart which enables pickup by an automated truck. Additional refuse may be placed in standard rubbish containers or plastic bags, not to exceed 50 pounds. Items must be cut to a length not to exceed 4 feet. Loose items should be bundled and must not exceed 50 pounds in weight. All furniture, household appliances, hot water tanks, and similar items will be accepted on the day of normal service.



Schools

Mayfield City Schools are comprised of four diverse and dynamic communities: the cities of Highland Heights and Mayfield Heights and the villages of Gates Mills and Mayfield. The district serves approximately 3,900 students. Enrollment growth remains steady.

The District is comprised of four neighborhood grades K-5 elementary schools, a grades 6-8 middle school and a grades 9-12 high school. In addition to administering these schools, the District oversees three consortium programs which draw students from neighboring school districts: Millridge Center for Hearing Impaired Children (MCHI), an elementary school for hearing impaired students; the Cuyahoga East Vocational Education Consortium (CEVEC), a program which prepares older developmentally-handicapped students for work and independent living; and Excel T.E.C.C. which provides vocational, technical, and job skill training to high school students. Recently, they introduced STEM2M, a unique approach to increase student achievement by expanding the rigor of the current course offerings by creating a science, technology, engineering, math and medicine inquiry-based teaching environment K-12.







City Park is located at 1533 Chelmsford Road with an additional park access on Marsol Road.




Oakville Park
