



Public Works and Services Committee: Mr. Ballistrea stated Council received the Public Works minutes from March 21, 2019 that he had reported on at the March 25, 2019 Council meeting. The Committee is waiting for more data on the sidewalk program and will then hold another meeting.

Recreation and Parks Committee: Mr. Manno reported as follows:  
Resident Registration for Day Camp, Swim Lessons and Pool Passes is now open. City Hall - 8:30 am and 4:00 pm to register. Non-resident Registration opens on Friday, April 26.

The Bunny Brunch - Saturday, April 13 – 9 to 10:30 am at the DeJohn Community Center. Tickets are \$7.00 per person, pre-registration is required.

Bingo - Tuesday, April 30 from 12 – 2 pm at the DeJohn Community Center. A light lunch will be included and prizes awarded to winners of each game. The fee is \$5.00 per person and the registration deadline is Friday, April 25. Sponsored by The Fountains and The Greens.

Safety and Transportation Committee: Mr. DeJohn reported on the meeting held this evening. The committee is recommending the replacement of Fire Department portable and hand held radios. They are over 15 years old and need to be replaced. This matter will be on the next Council agenda.

Mr. DeJohn reminded everyone about the Your Public Safety App, which can be downloaded to a smartphone and would allow safety forces to pinpoint a person's location in case of emergency. He encouraged everyone to look at this app.

Board of Zoning Appeals: Mrs. Sabetta stated a meeting is scheduled for April 9, 2019.

Planning Commission: Mr. Ballistrea reported on the meeting held April 1, 2019. Copies of the minutes of the meeting were distributed to all members and are a part of the permanent record.

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PUBLIC COMMENT:

Fire Chief Bruce Elliott stated the Fire Department has been busy training, most recently for Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) through Hillcrest Hospital. The Department also had HAZMAT technical rescue training. It is important for the department to have general training of this type, even though it does not have an actual unit. as it is called for mutual aid for many area municipalities, especially in Lake and Geauga Counties. The department received notice that it will get the Fire Behavioral Lab trailer from the State Fire Marshall on May 7 and 8. There is no cost to the City. This is important training as well to show firefighters a flash over fire. The Star of Life Award from the State of Ohio will be given on May 22 in Columbus to four of our paramedics. The Chief is very proud of the men who were awarded this recognition.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2019-36: "A Resolution commending Phillip Skufca upon his retirement from the Service Department of the City of Mayfield Heights, Ohio." Mr. Murphy read the resolution by title only. Mrs. Sabetta moved for suspension of the rules, seconded by Mrs. Snider. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Manno, Ballistrea, DeJohn, Sabetta, Teresi, Snider, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. Mr. Manno moved for adoption, seconded by Mr. Ballistrea. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: DeJohn, Snider, Teresi, Ballistrea, Manno, Sabetta, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The resolution is adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-37: "A Resolution declaring Friday, April 26, 2019 as Arbor Day in the City of Mayfield Heights, Ohio." Mr. Murphy read the resolution by title only. Mrs. Teresi moved for suspension of the rules, seconded by Mrs. Snider. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Teresi, Sabetta, Snider, Manno, DeJohn, Ballistrea, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. Mrs. Teresi moved for adoption, seconded by Mr. Ballistrea. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Ballistrea, Teresi, Sabetta, DeJohn, Snider, Manno, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The resolution is adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-38: "A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with Gametime for the purchase of playground equipment for Oakville Park, and declaring an emergency." Mr. Murphy read the resolution by title only. Mrs. Snider moved for suspension of the rules, seconded by Mr. Ballistrea. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Snider, DeJohn, Manno, Ballistrea, Sabetta, Teresi, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. Mr. Manno moved for adoption, seconded by Mrs. Teresi. Mr. DeJohn asked if this was the last expense for Oakville Park. While he is not against the purchase and improving recreation, he wondered about expenses. Mayor DiCicco replied it would be hard to say if this was the last expense. Many things have not been replaced in a long time and the City wants to make improvements. Mrs. Finney commented she heard it was very crowded there yesterday, so people are using the park. Mr. Manno remarked while he is for this type of equipment he believes this kind of equipment may encourage vandalism by older kids and asked for more police surveillance there to protect the equipment and Mrs. Teresi echoed his statement. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Sabetta, Manno, Ballistrea, Teresi, Snider, DeJohn, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The resolution is adopted.

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ORDINANCE NO. 2019-9: "An Ordinance amending Chapter 1191 of the Codified Ordinances of the City titled "Signs" by amending Section 1191.10 pertaining to banners on utility poles and declaring an emergency." Mr. Murphy read the ordinance by title only. Mrs. Sabetta moved to place the ordinance on third reading. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Manno, Ballistrea, DeJohn, Sabetta, Teresi, Snider, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The ordinance is placed on third reading with a public hearing to be held April 22, 2019 at 6:45 P.M.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-10: "An Ordinance approving an amendment to the collective bargaining agreement negotiated between the City of Mayfield Height, Ohio and the Laborers' International Union of North America Local 860 (Service Department Bargaining Unit), by deleting Article 34, promotion to Service Director, approving the execution of said amendment by the Mayor and declaring an emergency." Mr. Murphy read the ordinance by title only. Mr. Manno moved to place the ordinance on first reading; seconded by Mr. DeJohn. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: DeJohn, Snider, Teresi, Ballistrea, Manno, Sabetta, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The ordinance is placed on first reading.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-11: "An Ordinance amending the zone map of the City of Mayfield Heights, Ohio, so as to rezone Permanent Parcel Numbers 861-29-003 through 861-29-005, inclusive, and 861-29-014 through 861-29-026, inclusive (consisting of 16 parcels on the undeveloped Jasmine Circle), from the current U-2A (1) Planned Unit Development District to U-7; Headquarters or Executive Offices Park District in the City of Mayfield Heights (corner of Cedar Road and Landerbrook Drive)." Mr. Murphy read the ordinance by title only. Mr. Manno moved to place the ordinance on first reading, seconded by Mrs. Snider. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Teresi, Sabetta, Snider, Manno, DeJohn, Ballistrea, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The ordinance is placed on first reading with a public hearing to be held May 13, 2019 at 6:45 P.M.


Mr. Ballistrea moved to add Ordinance No. 2019-12 to the agenda, seconded by Mrs. Sabetta. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Ballistrea, Teresi, Sabetta, DeJohn, Snider, Manno, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-12: "An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to amend the agreement with Henderson, Schmidlin & McGarry Co., L.P.A. to provide legal services from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019, and declaring an emergency." Mr. Murphy read the ordinance by title only. Mrs. Teresi moved for suspension of the rules, seconded by Mrs. Sabetta. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Ballistrea, Teresi, Sabetta, DeJohn, Snider, Manno, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. Mr. Manno moved for adoption, seconded by Mrs. Sabetta. Mr. Murphy explained the contract with the law firm provides that if he is no longer Law Director the contract terminates. The problem is he has initiated retirement through OPERS and cannot receive a pay check for two months. After that the Mayor can appoint a law director or reappoint him. This amendment allows for the City to have an acting law director or interim law director. This will provide that the City continues to have legal representation for those two months. Roll Call on motion as stated: AYES: Sabetta, Manno, Ballistrea, Teresi, Snider, DeJohn, Finney. NAYS: None. Motion carried. The ordinance is adopted.


Mrs. Snider, seconded by Mr. Ballistrea, moved to confirm the decision of the Planning Commission approving a preliminary/final site plan for a 525 sq. ft. outdoor dining area for Arrabiata's Restaurant at 6169 Mayfield Road. Mr. Ballistrea reported this was a unanimous approval to allow an outdoor patio. It will be near the sidewalk and fenced in. It met all the criteria of the design corridor and no variances were needed. Mrs. Teresi noted the electric and gas meters are on that side and wondered if they would be affected. Raymond Negrelli, owner of the property, stated the patio would stop before that portion of the wall. Mr. DeJohn asked how the patio would be accessed and Mr. Ballistrea stated from inside only. Mr. DeJohn asked if a door would be installed and Mr. Ballistrea said yes. There would also be an egress gate from the patio. All in favor, *motion carried.*

There being no further business to come before Council, Mrs. Finney adjourned the meeting at 7:35 P.M.
