Cans	All metal food and beverage cans such as pop, beer, soup, vegetable and tuna can be recycled in your community's recycling program. Cans should be emptied, rinsed then recycled.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/cans
Cans	Aluminum cans placed in curbside recycling are processed and turned back in to new cans and foil that you'll see on store shelves. Steel cans are recycled into new cans, car parts and even bridges.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/cans
Cartons	Recycle cartons through your curbside recycling program including milk, juice, soup and broth plus wine cartons. Cartons should be emptied and rinsed.  Replace the cap and place loose in your recycling cart.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/cartons

Glass	Glass includes food and beverage bottles and jars of any color. Glass bottles and jars should be emptied and rinsed. Replace the lid and put in your curbside recycling. No need to remove the label. #CuyahogaRecycles	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/glass

Paper & Boxes	Recycle better: Empty then flatten those cardboard boxes for your curbside recycling. It's also important to keep them dry. #CuyahogaRecycles	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/cardboard
Paper & Boxes	Shredded paper should not be placed in your curbside recycling because the shreds are too small to be sorted at the Materials Recovery Facility (recycling plant) that receives your recyclables. Instead, please place shredded paper in paper bags and recycle at a paper drop off bin location.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/paper_shredding
Paper & Boxes	Include newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, envelopes, greeting cards, coupon packets, phone books, cereal and dry food boxes, shoe boxes, toothpaste or OTC medicine boxes, paper tubes, tissue boxes, cardboard (flattened) and paper egg cartons loose (not bagged) in your recycling cart.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/paper and boxes

Plastic Bags	Plastic bags and plastic film should NOT be placed in your curbside recycling. Bags and film get tangled in the sorting machines at the recycling facilities and cause major problems for the recycling process.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/plastic_bags
Plastic Bags	Plastic bags can be recycled at many retail locations, including Giant Eagle, Lowe's, Marc's, Target and Walmart stores. A collection bin can usually be found near the store entrance or the customer service desk.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/plastic_bags
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Plastic cups and utensils are not recyclable in your curbside mix. What will you use for your next party?	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/plastic_cups
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Any plastic bottle, jar, jug or tub can be placed in your curbside recycling. Recycle plastic food and beverage bottles, shampoo and conditioner plus laundry detergent and bleach bottles. Bottles should be emptied and rinsed. Plastic Bottles & Jugs	Not all plastics with the 1-7 symbol are recyclable. Do not include plastic bags, plastic beverage cups, berry or produce containers, plastic blister packaging, Styrofoam packaging, cups and food containers, plastic utensils or hangers.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/plastic_bottles
Plastic Bottles & Jugs	We no longer look at the numbers on plastics to determine if a plastic container is recyclable. Those numbers are actually resin codes used by the plastics industry to identify the chemicals used to make the container. What Do I Do With?	Do not place fryer oil in the trash or down a drain. Fryer oil from a home can be properly disposed at a household hazardous waste collection.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/fryer_oil
What Do I Do With?	Grill propane tanks can be recycled for free at any Blue Rhino location. Learn more.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/propane_tanks
What Do I Do With?	VCR and cassette tapes do not belonbg in curbside recycling. Place them in the regular trash for disposal. Learn more.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/VCR tapes
What Do I Do With?	Fluorescent tube bulbs contain mercury and should be recycled properly. Spent LED and incandescent bulbs go in the regular trash.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/fluorescent_bulbs
What Do I Do With?	Do not pour unused or unwanted antifreeze into a storm sewer or down the drains in your home. Storm drains flow directly to streams and Lake Erie.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/antifreeze
What Do I Do With?	Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) can be recycled for free at Lowe's and Home Depot stores. Look for the lobby dropbox.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/fluorescent_bulbs
What Do I Do With?	Old single-use alkaline batteries can be placed in the trash for disposal. Recycle the rechargeable ones for free at a retail store near you. Learn more.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/batteries
What Do I Do With?	Do not place Styrofoam in your curbside recycling. Styrofoam "clamshell" containers, cups and trays cannot be recycled in Northeast Ohio. These items should be disposed of in the regular trash.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/styrofoam
What Do I Do With?	Old clothes don't belong in your curbside recycling. Finad a place to donate your unwanted shirts, shoes and other fabric items.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/clothing

What Do I Do With?	Give used medical equipment a second chance. Donate hospital beds, wheelchairs and walkers to an organization that (can and will) reuse. Learn more.	www.cuyahogarecycles.org/Medical Equipment and Supplies
